Here I am God!

As we walk this very powerful Holy Week together, let us reflect on the words of the First Reading: "Here is my servant whom I uphold, my chosen one with whom I am pleased. Upon whom I have put my Spirit; he shall bring forth justice to the nations, not crying out, not shouting, not making his voice heard in the street." (Isaiah 42:1-2) These words of Scripture beckon us back to the proclamation spoken to Jesus by His loving Father, "This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased."
