- 5 St. Agatha Martyr, patron of those with breast cancer, rape victims, and the human trafficked * We pray for all those who are victims of the above.
- St. Paul Miki & Companions Executed for their preaching of the Christian faith in Japan * We pray today for all those throughout the world who are persecuted because of their religious beliefs. International Day of Zero Tolerance of Female Genital Mutilation (UN) * We pray that all governments will outlaw the practice of genital mutilation.
- Dom Helder Camara (b. 1909) Bishop of El Salvador, Strong advocate for the rights of the poor once said, "When I feed the poor, they call me a saint, but when I ask why the poor are hungry, they call me a communist."

 - Women were given the right to vote in 1920 by the 19th Amendment [50 years later]
